
Each student has been assigned to a group to read and study ONE ACT from the play

Each group will be responsible for sharing with the class the following activities:

1. A summary of the entire Act
2. Choose a scene from the play and re-write it into a modern version
3. Select a scene (50-75 lines) and perform it for the class
4. Identify four important quotes and explain what they mean and why they're important
5. Create a Twitter conversation between 2 characters. You must exchange at least 20 lines of text.
6. Identify two themes from our Tone and Theme handout and identify lines of text that show that theme is developed in Macbeth
7. Make a modern day comparison, either to the theme or a character, of Macbeth to some person or event in the world today. Explain the similarities
8. Create a Facebook page and wall for a character of your choosing from your assigned Act

You will be given class time to work with your group. Periodically, you will be given the opportunity to evaluate the input or cooperation of each member of their group.
